UTAH LAW REQUIRES THAT THAT FOLLOWING DISEASES BE REPORTED TO YOUR LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT OR THE UTAH DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IMMEDIATELY.

- Anthrax
- Botulism
- Cholera

UTAH LAW REQUIRES THAT THE FOLLOWING DISEASES BE REPORTED TO YOUR LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT OR THE UTAH DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH WITHIN 3 WORKING DAYS AFTER IDENTIFICATION

- Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS)
- Adverse event resulting after smallpox vaccination
- Amebiasis
- Arbovirus infection, including Saint Louis encephalitis and West Nile virus infection
- Brucellosis
- Campylobacteriosis
- Chancroid
- Chickenpox
- Chlamydia trachomatis infection
- Coccidioidomycosis
- Colorado tick fever
- Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease and other transmissible human spongiform encephalopathies
- Cryptosporidiosis
- Cyclospora infection
- Dengue fever
- Echinococcosis
- Ehrlichiosis (human granulocytic, human monocytic, or unspecified)

- Encephalitis
- Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli (STEC) infection
- Giardiasis

SOUTHEASTERN UTAH DISTRICT HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Reporting communicable diseases is a requirement that bypasses HIPAA regulations.

26-6-6 Duty to report individual suspected of having communicable disease.

The following shall report to the department or the local health department regarding any individual suffering from or suspected of having a disease that is communicable, as required by department rule:

- 1) Health care providers as defined in Section 78-14-3;
- 2) Facilities licensed under Title 26, Chapter 21, Health Care Facility Licensure and Inspection Act;
- 3) Health care facilities operated by the federal government;
- 4) Mental health care facilities;
- 5) Care facilities licensed by the Department of Human Services;
- 6) Nursing homes and other care facilities;
- 7) Dispensaries, clinics or laboratories that diagnose, test, or otherwise care for individuals who are suffering from a disease suspected of being communicable;
- 8) Individuals who have knowledge of others who have a communicable disease;
- 9) Individuals in charge of schools having responsibility for any individuals who have a disease suspected of being communicable; and
- 10) Child care programs, as defined in Section 26-39-102.
